Registration will include one patch per scout and 2 leader patches per unit.

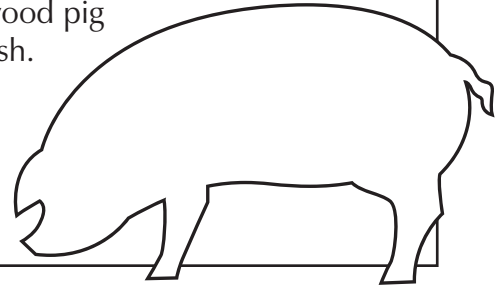
10 COMPETITION POINTS WILL BE AWARDED TO THOSE UNITS REGISTERING ON TIME.

SCHEDULED ACTIVITIES:

- Rope board walking
- Knot Tying Challenge – 2 man teams/timed event. Patrols will select 2 scouts to compete. 2 minutes will be allowed per knot with points awarded for correctly tied knots. Knots for competition include: Square knot, half-hitch, 2 half hitches, clove hitch, timber hitch and taut-line hitch.
- Fire building – Patrols race against the clock to build a fire high enough to burn through a string.
- Lizzigator Swamp - Everyone's favorite returns for a timed competition.
- LNT (Leave No Trace) Question Game / Webelos Woods Jeopardy. Patrols answer as many questions as they can in the time allowed. Points are based on the number of questions answered correctly and the time used.
- Stretcher Relay – After completing a training section, Patrols compete in a timed relay.
- Shooting Sports: Archery, BB Guns and Wrist rocket (Sling Shot) ranges will be ready!!
- Semaphore – Patrols will receive seven simple words sent from pavillion to pavillion. Points awarded for accuracy. Words included are: high, flag, tent, camp, fire, tree and knot. Log onto <http://web.ukonline.co.uk/scoutnotebook/communicator/images/semaphore.gif>
- Craft Pavillion - Scouts will create a take home craft.
- Tug-O-War - Another camp favorite pits Patrols against one another to vie for bragging rights!
- Heading For The Barn Challenge – All patrols are invited to compete in a game of skill and fun.
- Decorate a Pig Competition - Patrols bring their decorated pig to be displayed for judging.
- Potato Sack Races - a State Fair Favorite
- Pie Eating Contest - A representative from each patrol will race to finish a "Cool Whip" pie (please be aware of any food allergies.) YUM!
- Greased "Pig" Relay
- Marble Belt Loop station
- Special Leader/Adult Competition Activity.

Volunteers are needed to insure the success of this event by assisting with the planned activities.

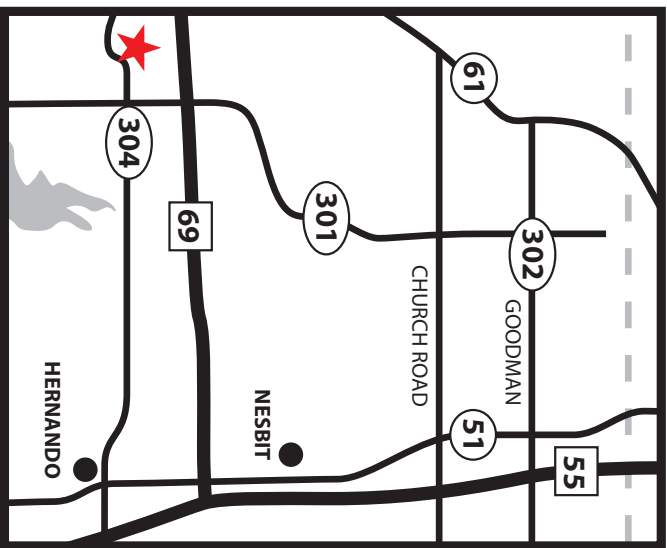
Every unit is expected to provide one volunteer for each activity period: 10:15a - Noon and 2:00p until 4:00p.

5 Spirit Points will be awarded for every EXTRA Volunteer up to 4 Volunteers.

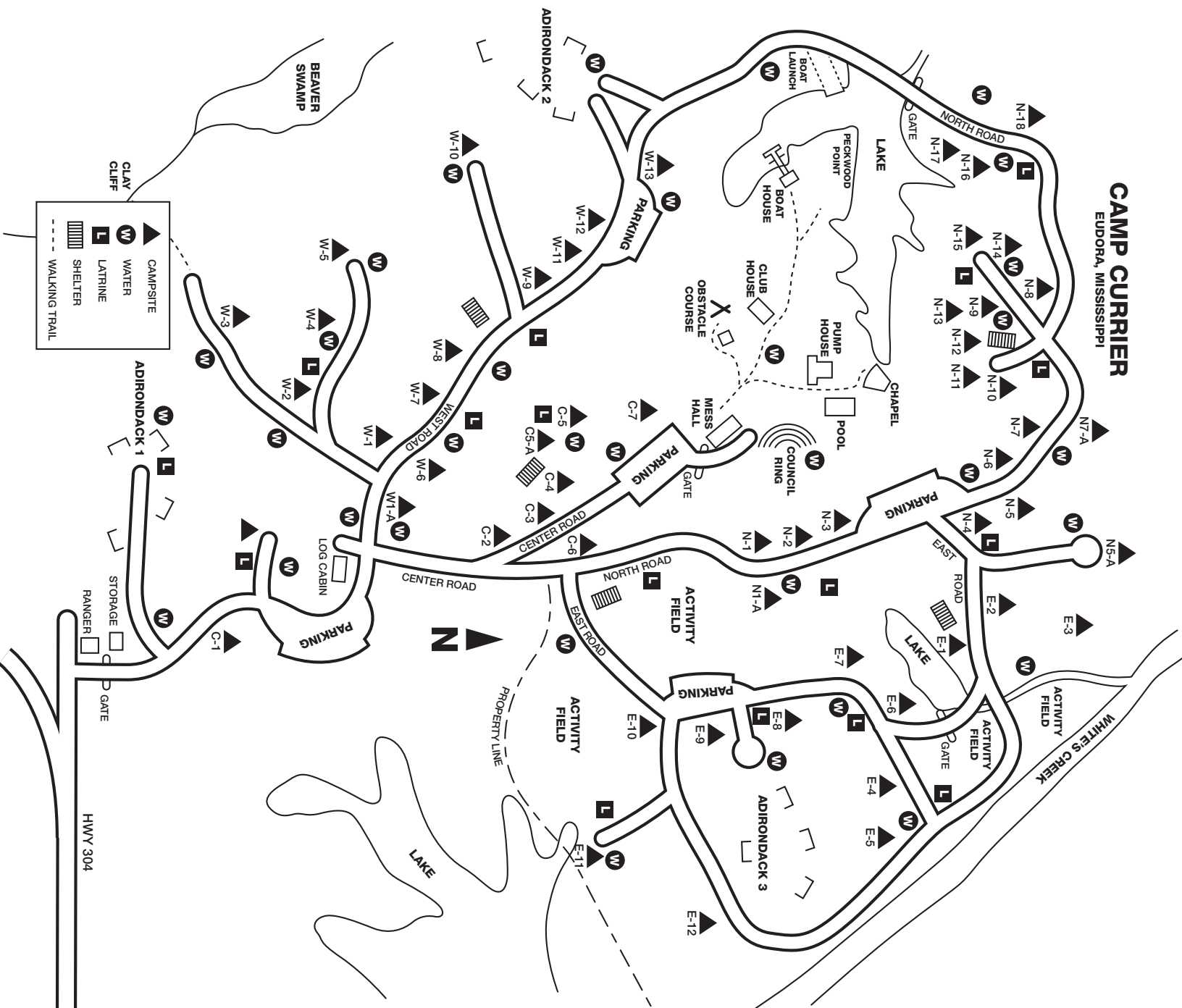

- Travel south on I-55 to the I-69 exit.
- Take I-69 west to the Highway 301 exit.
- Exit onto 301 heading south.
- Arriving at the 4-way stop at Hwy 304, turn right, heading west.
- After a mile or so, Hwy 304 will make a sharp turn to the left. You will veer right at the Camp Currier sign.
- Take the first right into the camp.
- Speed Limit in camp is 15mph.
- Please unload vehicles and remove them from the site BEFORE setting up camp.
- Vehicles to be parked in the designated areas only.
